Oral Health Integration for Physicians FAQ

What is oral health integration?

Oral health integration means including oral health in your medical practice. PacificSource encourages physicians to integrate oral health into their practices.

Why should I consider oral health integration for my practice?

Oral health affects overall health. Despite collective efforts and for a variety of reasons, too many people go without the dental care they need to be optimally healthy. Oral disease negatively impacts people throughout their lives and can result in serious health consequences for:

- Children
- People who are pregnant
- People with chronic diseases (like diabetes and cardiovascular disease), including behavioral health conditions
- Seniors

Interprofessional collaboration is critical to improving oral health and overall health. Studies show that people are more likely to follow through with healthy behaviors (such as dental care) when their physician advises them to do so.

What specific activities can I participate in that will help me integrate oral health into my practice?

Consistent with the <u>Oral Health Delivery Framework</u>, integrating oral health into patient care can include an array of activities along a spectrum.

- Asking patients about their oral health and educating patients about how improving oral health improves overall health.
- Referring patients to dental care and following up with them about their dental visit.
- Providing your patients with toothbrushing kits. New brushes, floss, and toothpaste promote daily preventive care.
- Completing oral health assessments with your patients. PacificSource reimburses physicians for this service, consistent with our policy and applicable rules.
- Applying fluoride varnish. PacificSource reimburses physicians for this service, consistent with our policy and applicable rules.
- Establishing bidirectional communication with your patient's dental provider or dental care organization to coordinate care, share care plans and lab results, and ensure referrals and care gaps are addressed.
- Partnering with a dental care organization to host mobile dentistry or teledentistry at your practice.
